Step 1

Pick your fabrics 😊 I am using a grey/aqua dot for my background and bright combinations for my stars.



Step 2

Make your flying geese

Layer 2 accent squares on a large background square. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the accent squares and sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the line. Cut on your drawn line and press away from the background. Place another accent square on the bare background corner, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the background, sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away on each side of your line. Cut on your line, press away from the background and trim to the size listed in your pattern. I like using the Creative Grids Ultimate Flying Geese Ruler for trimming.



Step 3

Make your Center square in a square

Fold your center fabric in quarters and press.



Line a triangle piece so base is even with a side and the point of the triangle is on the crease line. Sew and press. Repeat for the opposite side.



Follow the same steps on the remaining two sides.



Press and trim.

Step 4



Sew a flying geese block to each side of your square in a square. Press towards your center

Add a background square to each side of the remaining flying geese. Press away from the geese.



Add these to the center unit. Your seams should nestle together because you pressed in opposite directions.



Pretend this doesn't have the applique on it 😊

Step 5

Using your favorite applique method (I used fusible web) Cut out the circle templates from your Ohio Star template page. The template page said to cut 4 of each size....I did 3 of each because we are making 3 blocks. Applique these to the centers of your stars. I only fused and will go back and add decorative stitches later.
